## OKLAHOMA POINTS OF INTEREST

- OKC Riversport**  
Oklahoma City: The Chesapeake Boathouse is home to OKC Riversport, your passport to the most exciting sports available on the Oklahoma River and Lake Overholser. Riversport helps visitors learn everything they need to get on the water, whether it's kayaking, canoeing or dragon boating. Riversport offers rowing and kayaking lessons for all ages, plus kayak and paddleboat rentals daily. 725 S. Lincoln Blvd. (405) 552-4040
- Bricktown Historic District**  
Oklahoma City: Just east of Downtown is Bricktown, Oklahoma City's renovated warehouse district. OKC's biggest hot spot for fine restaurants, clubs, theaters, galleries and shops, as well as a mile-long pedestrian waterway that cuts through the heart of Bricktown. Makes for an unforgettable visit to Oklahoma City. (405) 236-8666
- The Castle of Muskogee**  
Muskogee: A 30,000 square foot Castle, nestled within 60 acres, and encompassing over 85 permanent structures creating the village of Castleton, is the host to the Oklahoma Renaissance Festival. - Gilcrease Museum**  
Tulsa: The world's most comprehensive collections of American Indian and Western art, this nationally-celebrated museum includes extensive exhibits on America's prehistory, settlement and expansion, plus outdoor gardens. A rare copy of the Declaration of Independence is also on display. Guided tours offered. Open Tue.-Sun. 10a.m.-5p.m. (888) 855-2278
- National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum**  
Oklahoma City: Features the finest contemporary artists in the nation, as well as significant works by master artists. The complex contains a turn-of-the-century Western town, boasts both botanical and natural gardens and major exhibition galleries. Also on site is a unique children's building, museum store and restaurant. 1700 NE 63rd Street, Oklahoma City, OK. (405) 478-2250
- Oklahoma Aquarium**  
Jenks: See the largest bull sharks in captivity through a one-of-a-kind, walk-through tunnel, plus hundreds of other fascinating creatures. Feed and even touch stingrays and small sharks! You'll be charmed by playful river otters, beavers and raccoons in the new Hayes Family Ozark Stream. Don't miss the Karl and Beverly White National Fishing Tackle Museum featuring a \$4 million collection of antique rods, reels, lures and other memorabilia. (918) 296-FISH (3474)
- Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum**  
Oklahoma City: The Memorial grounds include the Field of Empty Chairs with each chair honoring one of the 168 people who were killed; the monumental bronze-clad Gates of Time; a shallow 318-foot long reflecting pool; the promontory and Survivor Tree; Rescuers Orchard and a special area for children. Open 24 hours-a-day, seven days-a-week. The interactive learning museum tells the story of the April 19, 1995 bombing of the Alfred P. Murray Federal Building. 620 N. Harvey, Oklahoma City, OK. - Oklahoma History Center**  
Oklahoma City: The museum presents a historical overview of Oklahoma, from prehistoric times to oil field wildcaters to the space program. Research library and historical archives also available for public use. Open Mon.-Sat. 10a.m.-5p.m., Closed Sun. (405) 522-5248
- Paseo Art District**  
Oklahoma City: The Paseo is Oklahoma City's Art District featuring studios and galleries of over 75 artists along the tree-lined street. The painters, potters, photographers and actors intermingling with dress shops, gift shops, restaurants and a coffee shop. Built in 1929 as the first shopping district north of downtown, The Paseo is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. NW 30th & Dewey, Oklahoma City, OK. (405) 525-2688
- Sam Noble Oklahoma Museum of Natural History**  
Norman: Located on the University of Oklahoma campus, this facility is the nation's largest university-based museum. Exhibit space covers 50,000 sq. ft. and includes five galleries and exhibits that give visitors an in-depth tour of more than 300 million years of Oklahoma's fascinating natural history. Open: Mon.-Sat. 10a.m.-5p.m., Sun. 1-5p.m. (405) 325-4712
- Science Museum Oklahoma**  
Oklahoma City: The museum houses over eight acres of hands-on science experiences with thousands of space, aviation and cultural artifacts in the mix. With the excitement of live entertainment shows, one-of-a-kind IMAX film experiences and a newly renovated Science Floor, Science Museum Oklahoma rocks. From traveling beyond the Milky Way in the Planetarium Theater to witnessing live explosions in Science Live, the museum allows your inner-child to run wild. 2100 N.E. 52nd St. (405) 602-6664
- POPS**  
Arcadia: A trip down historic Route 66 in Oklahoma isn't complete without a stop at the unique and colorful POPS. Located in Arcadia just east of Edmond, POPS is an iconic addition along the Mother Road. Its ultra-modern architecture of red rock and steel trusses is a draw for visitors from across the nation. A four-ton, 66-foot sculpture of a soda bottle covered in dazzling multi-colored LED lights in front of POPS can't be missed and pays tribute to the main attraction at POPS: over 500 kinds of soda. From berry soda to classic cola, POPS has it all. POPS also features a gas station, and visitors can fill up their tanks before getting back on Route 66. Visitors can also fill up on food in the old-fashioned diner at POPS. Lunch and dinner are served daily. After a visit to POPS, you're guaranteed to greet Route 66 with a smile. - Woolaroc Ranch Museum and Wildlife Preserve**  
Bartlesville: Established in 1925, Woolaroc is a 3,600 acre ranch and wildlife preserve that is open throughout the year as an educational and historical attraction. The museum houses a world-class collection of western art, artifacts and special exhibits. Also features Native American Heritage Center, gardens, trails and over 700 animals, including buffalo, elk and longhorns. Open Tue.-Sun. 10a.m.-5p.m. Closed Mon. (888) 966-5276
